Enrollment at UZH

In brief

Follow instructions in your UZH Acceptance Letter – **enrollment deadline is 7 September 2026**

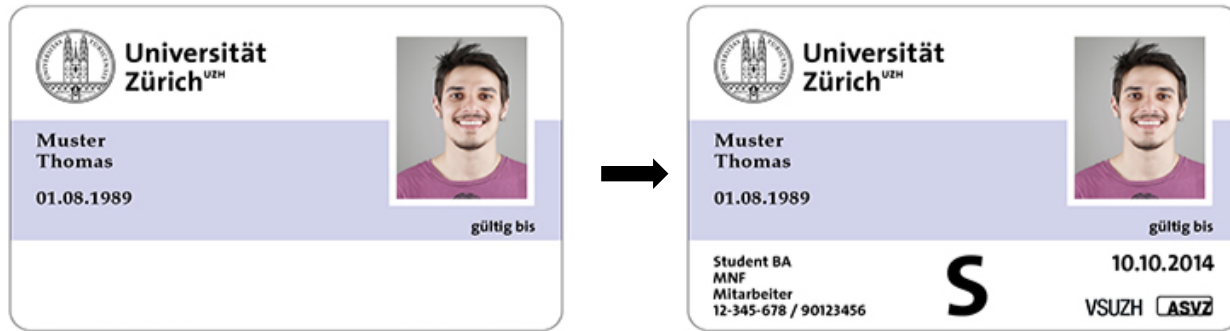
In more detail

1. Use [→ contact form](#) to confirm your arrival date and provide your **Swiss address** (where you can receive post) after your arrival
2. Invoice for semester fees will be made available to you online; pay it as soon as possible
3. Once UZH receives your payment, you will be sent your proof of matriculation vouchers and your student card by post at the address you provided, plus your UZH credentials online via the application portal
4. Use your UZH credentials (shortname, password) to book your modules etc.

Please note that it can take up to two weeks to receive your documents by post.

Student Card

Make sure to → validate your student card (print your information on your student ID). This includes your study level, student number, VSUZH and ASVZ logos



You will need the card for

- Identification at the University (e.g. at examinations, for libraries etc.)
- Pass for special prices in the cafeterias
- Print, copy and scan at UZH multifunction devices: → UZH Print plus
- Student discounts outside of the university
- Electronic access to buildings and facilities if the card is enabled for access rights
- Some functions of the UZH Card are also available electronically on the → UZH now app

Your UZH Email Account

[→ First steps](#) in setting up your account. Make sure you check your UZH e-mail account regularly! With your UZH email account you will have access to [→ Microsoft 365 \(Outlook\)](#). UZH uses **two-factor authentication**.

Student Portal and OLAT

Student Portal

Check your course schedule and your exam results on your [→ UZH Student Portal](#) (through Microsoft Online). Modules will only show up in your course schedule after you have booked them.

OLAT

OLAT (= **O**nline **L**earning **A**nd **T**raining platform) is used by most lecturers at UZH to manage their courses and to share course material with you.

Module Booking – Module Cancellation

- You can only book modules **during the module booking period** / after you have **paid your semester fees**
- Take into account the different → booking and cancellation deadlines
- Don't miss cancellation deadlines for module you no longer want! If you miss it and don't complete the module, it will **reflect as a failed attempt in your transcript**.
- **Canceling exams:** Petitions for canceling exams due to illness must be handed in to the dean's office of your faculty **before** the exam is taken.

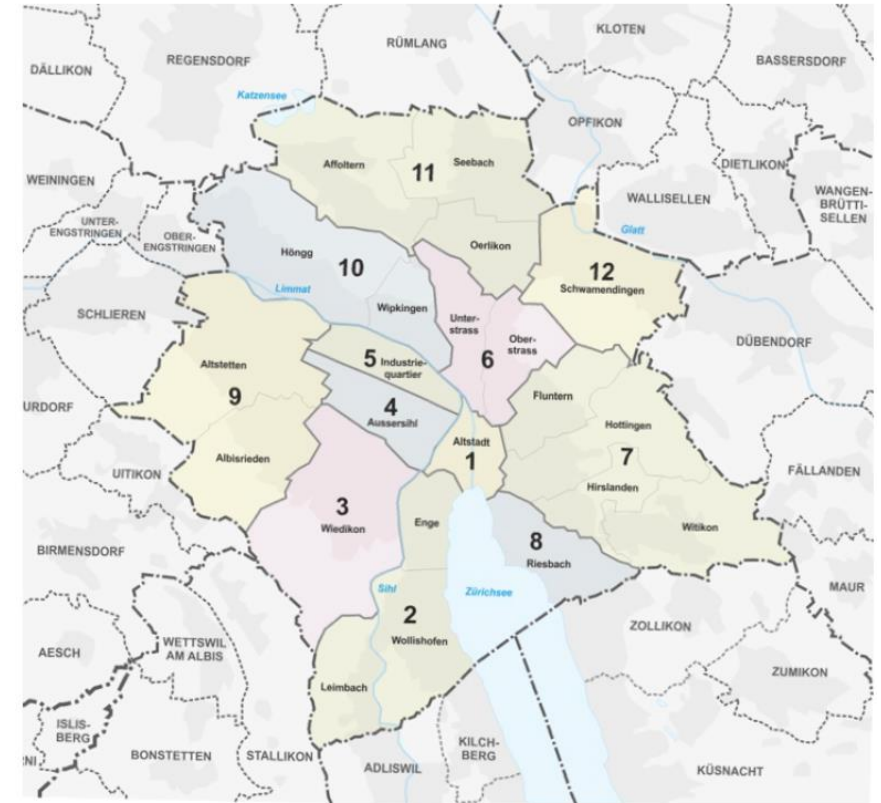
Registration at the Residents' Registration Office («Personenmeldeamt»)

Registering for a Residence Permit

- **Within 14 days** of arrival in your district of residence (and in the Canton that issued your visa)
- you will need to book an appointment → Registration and necessary documents
- If you live outside the city of Zurich you will need to visit the so-called «Einwohnerkontrolle» in your place of residence
- Make sure to keep your residence permit on you at all times, esp. when traveling
- Don't forget that you need to → extend your residence permit every year

Extending your Residence Permit: Required Documents

- Renewed proof of sufficient financial means (if you required a visa), or a letter stating that your finances will be covered (if you didn't need a visa)
- Confirmation of matriculation (≠ proof of enrollment) – this must be ordered from the Student Administration Office



Health Insurance

In Brief

- Under Swiss law it is mandatory to get sufficient health insurance coverage **within 3 months** of your arrival
- After registering for a residence permit you will receive a letter stating the same from the municipal health authorities. **Please keep this letter**

Exemption

As an international student, you apply for an exemption from the compulsory health insurance if:

- you are legally insured by an EU/EFTA/UK state, have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) and do not plan on working in Switzerland
- you take out Swiss health insurance for international students, which is a cheaper package specifically designed for international students (see Factsheet on page 4, question 11)
- you are covered by a private health insurance from an EU or non-EU country

Work

If you take up a paid part-time job, you **cannot apply for an exemption and need to get a Swiss health insurance** (regular or for international students).

We will be holding an information session dedicated solely to health insurance on 14 October 2026 (details to follow).

Social Insurance

In Brief

- All international students will be assigned a so-called AHV number by SVA (Social Insurance Authority)
 - Annually, SVA sends out a questionnaire via e-mail to all UZH students, where they ask you if you are a student & to check if you have to pay insurance contributions:
 - Please make sure to complete the form - this does not mean that you will have to pay.
 - As an **international student without employment in Switzerland**, you will **not need to pay anything**.
 - **International students with employment in Switzerland** need to **contact their employer about their obligation to contribute**.
- Please contact the municipality of your place of residence to receive your AHV number

Working while studying

In Brief

- you may accept a paid part-time job of no more than 15 working hours a week (full-time employment is permitted during the regular semester vacations)
 - Bachelor & Master students from countries outside EU/EFTA must have lived in Switzerland for at least 6 months to obtain a work permit unless they get a job at their UZH institute.
 - Your future employer will need a letter confirming that your employment will not interfere with your studies. Please contact the dean's office of your faculty for this. Law students are asked to contact the Student Center of the Faculty of Law.

Language Center

Language Courses for different languages (e.g. German as a foreign language)

- **Enrollment period for semester courses** fall semester 2026: **7 September (morning) until 18 September 2026**
- Allocation on basis of first come, first served
- Language Center of UZH and ETH Zurich

Self-Access Center

- library for autonomous learning of foreign languages
- Staff: two teachers from the language center and ten students, each of us responsible for at least one language

Teaching Activities

- Self-Access Center offers a range of learning activities (e.g. language get-togethers, writing workshops, games events, film clubs, and book clubs). These are designed to support your autonomous and cooperative language learning

You can come to them with all kinds of issues, for example

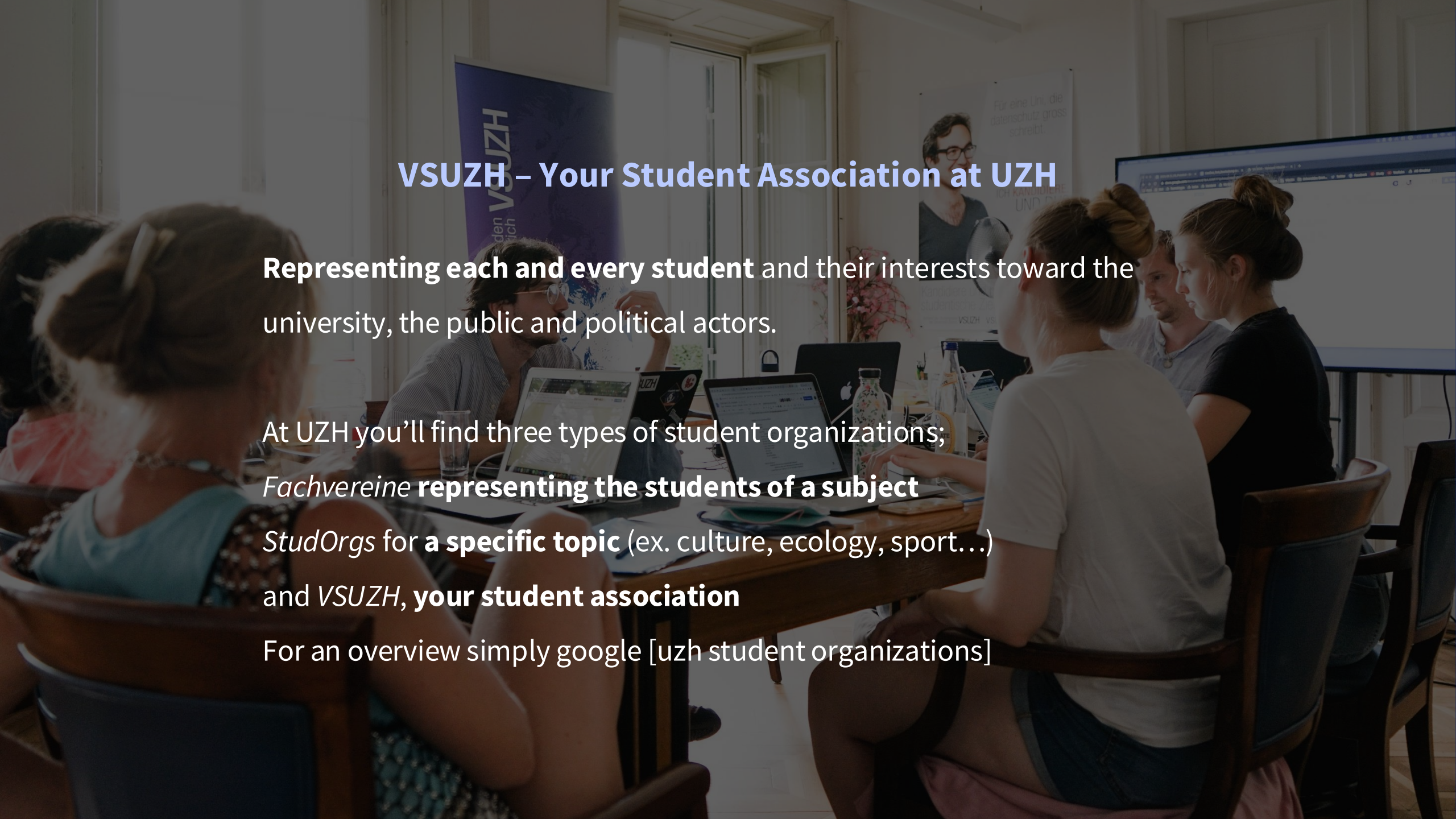
- problems in a relationship or family problems

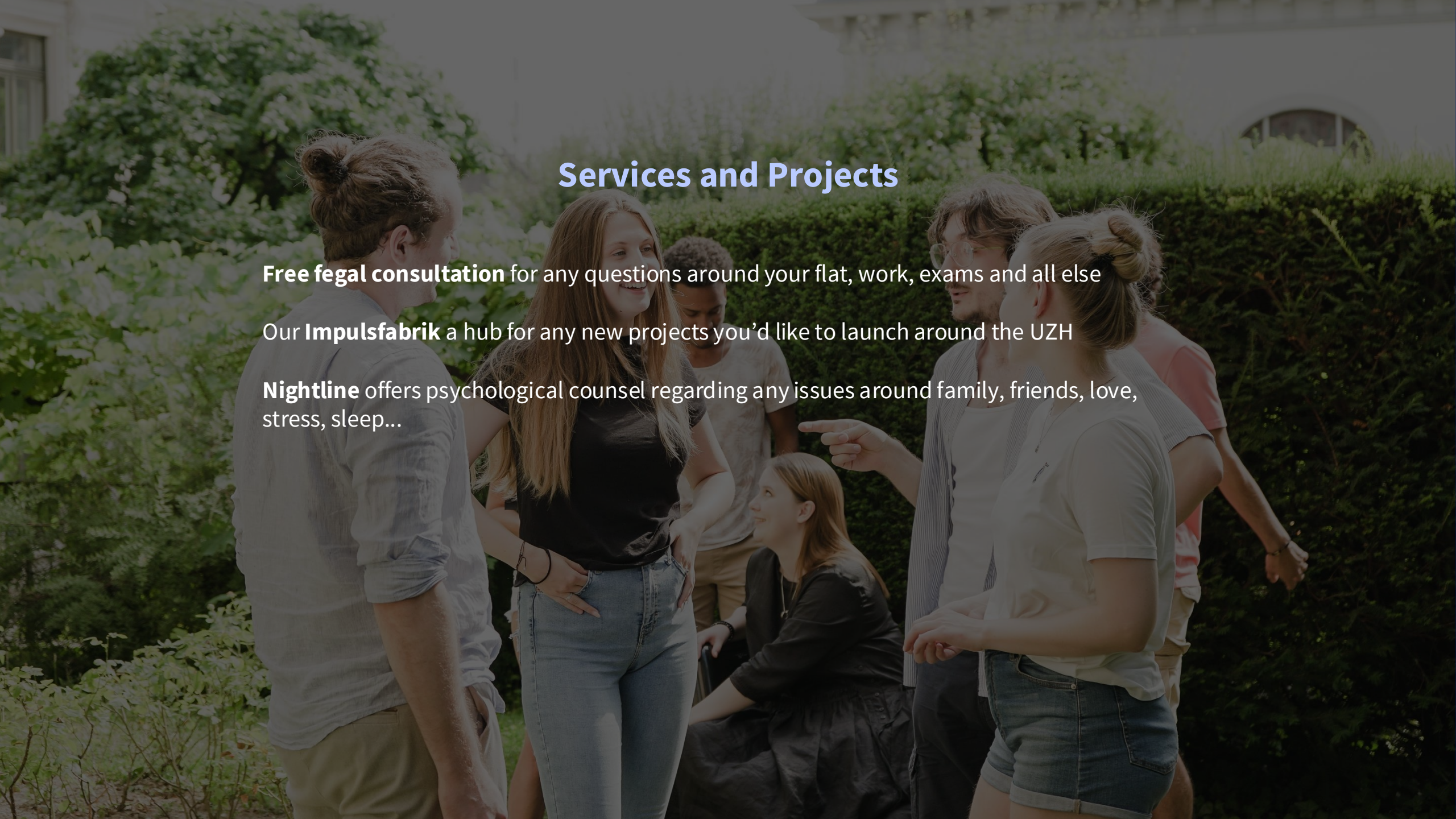
