Scholarships

This concerns all students who have been informed by us that they will be receiving a scholarship for their exchange stay at UZH and have signed a Grant Agreement. Due to restricted opening hours of the cash desk, you will only be able to pick up your scholarship during certain dates and hours. In order to receive your scholarship form, you will need to register for a time slot on <u>Eventbrite</u>.

Please note that each time slot is limited to 25 students and registration is first-come, first-served. You can only pick up your scholarship form on the day and time you registered for. After you collect your scholarship form at our office in room KOL-E-17 in the UZH main building, you will then need to go to the UZH cash desk right away to get the scholarship money in cash.
